1 William Street, Brisbane (Woods Bagot). High rise mixed use commercial tower designed to accommodate the Queensland Public Service, with floorplates of 1607 m² to 2086 m², 119 977 m².

Brookfield Place Tower 2, Perth (Woods Bagot). 5-Star Green Star PCA Prime-grade 82-metre office tower located in Central Perth, with significant public space, new generation workspaces, car parking, end of trip and high quality conference facilities. 43 000 m², \$260m.

Emirates Twin Towers, Dubai (Woods Bagot). Upon completion in 1999-2000 The Emirates Towers was one of the worlds tallest commercial and hotel towers in the world.

Index Tower, Dubai (Woods Bagot). 326 metre high mixed use tower located in the heart of the Dubai International Financial Centre (DIFC), including 78 220 m² of commercial and 126 510 m² of luxury residential apartments. 386 950 m², US\$365m.

Nakheel Tall Tower and Harbour, Dubai (Woods Bagot). Four mixed use towers, linked by sky bridges and gardens to form the appearance of one singular construct. Each tower has its own individual core which rise to a series of vertical wind slots at the building's upper-most level. 1.2 km tall, 2 000 000 m².

The Precinct Towers Applecross, Perth (Woods Bagot). A two stage residential development in the exclusive Applecross suburb of Perth including two residential towers, offices and a retail podium forming a new vibrant precinct .

Burj The Residences Phase 1, Towers 1-6, Dubai (Woods Bagot). 743 residential apartments across six high rise towers and 4-storey podium. Facilities include squash / badminton courts, gymnasiums, mini theatre, indoor / outdoor children's play area, meeting / multifunction rooms, library, business centre, swimming pools and recreation area, and 1000-space carpark. 170 000 m², US\$209.1m Phase 1 & 2.

Kempinski Resort The Wave, Oman (Woods Bagot). Waterfront hotel with 310-guest rooms and suites, 10 restaurants and bars, ballroom, health club, kids club, spa, 11 function rooms and access to 400-berth Al Mouj Marina and PGA-standard 18-hole golf course.

Qatar Science and Technology Park (Woods Bagot). Master plan encompassing 123 ha of land integrated with the Qatar Foundation, new teaching hospital and convention centre.

Bahrain City Centre, Bahrain (Woods Bagot). World class, three level retail complex of 450 000 m² including 20-screen cinema, indoor / outdoor water park, food court and 13 restaurants.
